Rally-goers, be advised that we have a caveat: our hosts at Cool Breeze warn us NOT set the GPS to Cool Breeze to get to the campground. I don't know why, but they recommend using the written directions from their webpage.

<u>From Blue Ridge Parkway</u> take exit at milepost 215. Go approximately 1/2 mile west on SR#89 to Edmonds Rd. (SR#316) on the left. Turn left on Edmonds Rd. and the campground is on the right approx. 2 miles.

<u>From Winston Salem</u> take Highway 52 North to I-74 around Mt. Airy. Take Exit 6, Highway 89, turn left at end of ramp, Go west on Hwy 89 approx. 14 miles, across the Virginia state line, continue 1/2 mile past the Blue Ridge Parkway entrance to Edmonds Rd. (SR#613) on the left. Turn left on Edmonds Rd. and the campground is on the right approx. 2 miles.

<u>From Charlotte</u> take I-77 to Exit 100 Mt. Airy / Galax. Highway 89, Turn left at end of ramp, Go west on Hwy. 89 approx. 14 miles across the Virginia state line. Continue 1/2 mile past the Blue Ridge Parkway entrance to Edmonds Rd. (SR#316) on the left. Turn left on Edmonds Rd. and the campground is on the right approx. 2 miles.

From I-81 take I-77 South to Exit 14 Hillsville / Galax. Turn right at end of ramp onto Hwy. 58. Travel approx. 10 miles into Galax, take left on Hwy. 89 Truck Route till it ends and turn left onto Hwy. 89 (Main St.) at stop light. Go 5 miles to Edmonds Rd. on the right. Turn right and go 2 miles the campground is on the right.

The Blue Ridge Music Center is just 5 miles at Milepost 213.


The **New River** State Park is just 8 miles and offers many activities including the New River Trail for biking and hiking.

The return email address that went out with the previous notice does not accept reply messages.



PROPOSAL TO BE VOTED ON

The substance of the motion you are to vote on here is that the Chinook Camping Club would create an Associate Membership level. An Associate Member would be described as:

THINGS WE LEARN FROM EXPERIENCE!



Before the summer rally in July, we spent a month going through New England and into the Maritime Provinces in Canada. There were a few maintenance/repair glitches, but one in particular we could have avoided with some basic attention. In Maine, our refrigerator stopped running, so we sought out an RV repair shop in a small town (thank goodness for smart phones!) Turns out, all we really

needed to do was blow the crud out of the exterior refrigerator compartment because it was blocking the flame. Lesson here-check the compartment for debris from leaves etc, apply some air and you'll keep the fridge running!

Also note the discussion recently on Facebook about running the refrigerator on propane on the road, with a YouTube video explaining the possible hazards. <u>See the YouTube video></u>

RALLY PLANNING

We hope to have some rally planning discussions during the annual meeting rally in Galax. We have had some great rallies lately, but are always looking for ways to make them better! We would like to survey the membership with some questions about subjects including these:

1. Locations - Is destination with nearby attractions a priority; convenient to grocers, near major area or is a nice location for "club time" sufficient. What states or areas are preferred, suggested?



- 2. Campground Amenities full hook up, level sites, proximity to bathhouse, meeting room/pavilion
- 3. Activities during rally tech, travel, craft, open house, social time for organized activity, cards, etc.
- 4. Scheduling seasonally preferable, quantity? Jan March/April late May/early June October; "flash" rallies to supplement scheduled organized by member with meals, activities generated by members attending. (possibly a good choice by members in any given region for shorter distance to and from location)
- 5. Area coordinators: Have a member from each area N-S-W-Mid Atlantic, say a "committee" to scout locations and be the Wagonmaster and assist hosts when available. Members report to Pres. Have at least one present at each rally. More, great.
- 6. Meals ... Pot Luck, hot or cold hors d'œuvres for meet and greet, restaurants trips and catering.

Additionally, Sally Arnold has started formatting a signup sheet that we may be able to tweak to help rally hosts with the planning and organization of the meals and activities.

CHINOOK EATS: from Linda Stamper Banana Nut Pound Cake

- 1 1/2 cup salad oil
- 2 1/2 cup sugar
- 3 well beaten eggs
- 1 Tablespoon Vanilla
- 1 1/2 cup mashed bananas
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 3 cups plain flour
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 3/4 teaspoon salt

Mix together flour, soda and salt, then add all other ingredients. Pour into a large greased tube pan and


bake for 1 hour and 20 minutes at 350 degrees. Let stand for 15 minutes before turning out.
